

COURSE INFORMATION

The course covers a broad range of advanced skills and provides you with high-level capabilities for managing large incidents, major trauma, sudden cardiac arrest and emotionally disturbed and drug affected casualties.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

For participants interested in enrolling in this course:

- Must provide a valid Unique Student Identifier (USI) at the time of enrolment.
- For courses with pre-learning, access to a reliable device (e.g., computer, laptop, or smart phone) connected to the internet is required.
- Must complete pre-learning before coming to class as topics covered in pre-learning are not covered in the classroom.
- Must be able to perform CPR on a manikin on the floor for 2 minutes.

PARTICIPANT COHORT

Participants are drawn from across the Australian community as first aid is considered an important life skill. This training is appropriate for individuals within workplace settings as well as members of the public seeking advanced level of first aid education. It is particularly beneficial for participants employed in high-risk settings, those serving as primary responders in larger facilities or groups, or individuals working in locations where assistance might be delayed or reaching casualties may be challenging.

COURSE DURATION AND DELIVERY MODES

St John offers the following options:

- **4 days face to face workshop:** This is full face to face course and participants are required to attend all 4 days. Those participants who have completed HLTAID011 Provide First Aid in last twelve (12) months may be entitled to an exemption from the first two days.
- **2 days (face to face workshops with pre-work):** This is face to face course and with online prework. Participants are required to undertake online e-learning module prior to attending the face-to-face workshops for practice and assessment. Those participants who have completed HLTAID011 Provide First Aid in last twelve (12) months may be entitled to an exemption from the first day.

- **Assessment only:** The assessment only option will particularly suit participants who regularly apply first aid skills and engage in ongoing learning about first aid.

COURSE OUTLINE

This course covers the following topics among others:

- Major trauma management
- Respond to an emergency situation.
- Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR)
- Automated external defibrillation (AED)
- DRSABCD action plan
- fractures, dislocations, sprains and strains, using appropriate immobilisation techniques
- basic triage processes
- Medications and Pain management
- Drug and alcohol affected casualties
- Asthma and Anaphylaxis
- Shock and Choking

CERTIFICATE

On successful completion of this course, you will be issued a statement of attainment in:

- HLTAID009 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- HLTAID010 Provide basic emergency life
- HLTAID011 Provide First Aid
- HLTAID014 Provide Advanced First Aid

St John Ambulance advises, in accordance with The Safe Work Australia model Code of Practice: First Aid in the Workplace and the guidelines of the Australian Resuscitation Council, first aid skills are renewed every 3 years and resuscitation skills are renewed every 12 months.

ASSESSMENT METHODS

A successful outcome for this statement of attainment will be determined by a range of different methods including written assessment, observation of simulated and practical activities etc.
